In December 2011, the Student Association entered into an agreement with Durham College and UOIT whereby, (1) the Student Association assumed full responsibility for the campus radio station (known as 'Riot Radio') effective January 1, 2012; (2) the student fees collected (specific to the campus radio station) for the 2011-2012 academic year were paid to the Student Association; and (3) the operating expenses (specific to the campus radio station) for the 2011-2012 academic year were assumed by the Student Association.

During a previous year, the Student Association entered into an agreement with Durham College to invest in the renovation of two campus locations, specifically for the use by the Student Association and students. The Student Association has committed to contributing \$500,000 to Durham College over five years towards this purpose. During the current year, the Student Association paid \$100,000 to Durham College. The spaces in these two locations will be occupied by the Student Association for a period of ten years beginning in May 2011.
